- Pupils benefit from a wide range of opportunities to promote reading for pleasure.
- Staff receive regular training to teach the phonics programme well.
- Pupils show confidence when decoding and blending words because they are secure in their sounds.
- The school is ambitious to make a difference for pupils with SEND. These pupils benefit from precise learning plans. Teachers adapt knowledge to help them build their knowledge as well as their peers.
- Pupils' wider development is a strength and is at the heart of the school.
- The school goes above and beyond to develop pupils as responsible, respectful, and active citizens.
- Opportunities to enrich pupils' experiences are carefully mapped out. Pupils benefit from a range of visits and residentials to enhance the curriculum, develop their social skills and to build resilience.
- Pupils know they make a difference to the school through the many roles and responsibilities they have.
- 'Cultivating Futures' is at the heart of the many opportunities provided by the school. It enables pupils to care for the environment, develop empathy and to learn about nature. Pupils value this space and time for reflection.
- Those responsible for Governance have an accurate view of the school and they, along with the school, are ambitious for pupils to do well.
- Safeguarding is effective.

During the two-day inspection, our children were a credit to the school and to their parents/carers. The children spoke with enthusiasm and knowledge to the Inspector and were incredibly proud to share their learning and their setting.
