



#### <u>Safeguarding</u>

#### Child Safety and the Metaverse

Following the Christmas holiday, many children will be talking about the gifts which they have received. For some children they will have received electronic gifts and or games such as 'a Fortnite battle pass, a new PC, a PlayStation 5 etc.'. All devices which allow both unfettered access to the internet and expose children to voice chat, text chat and photo sharing with complete strangers are a major safeguarding concern.

This year presents an acceleration of vulnerability window as, VR headsets, connected to Facebook's Metaverse have been released onto the marketplace.

The Metaverse seeks to link users to the internet as a Virtual Entity through the use of Virtual Reality Headsets. This amplifies the safeguarding danger which children are exposed to online.

To help you understand this new, fast changing issue the NSPCC has published a guide to both the Metaverse and VR headsets.

We would also like to draw parent/carers attention to suggested age limits surrounding certain TV shows being streamed over a variety of platforms. One such programme, currently being streamed on Netflix, is 'Wednesday'. This has an age rating of 14+ but we have had reports this week of some of our children discussing this show with others after watching it and going into specific details which have been frightening and upsetting to those children.

Please can we kindly remind parents/carers to be extra vigilant not only surrounding online access but also to monitoring that your child/children are watching ageappropriate TV programmes. Thank you as always for your support.

You are strongly advised to name three preferences on the application form. Naming a second or third preference does not give you any less chance of getting a place at your preferred school. When making your decision you should...

> ..look at the admission arrangements on our website that will be used to allocate places for each school.

.consider naming your nearest or designated school as one of your preferences. You can find your nearest or designated school on our website.


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### Connor Downs Academy Shining Stars Friday 13th January 2023

#### Citizen – Perran (Year 3)


For being such a kind and caring role model with reading a story to a younger child during wet play. Well done Perran!
