
Young Mental Health Champions


Last Friday, five of our pupils attended a Wellbeing seminar for Young Mental Health Champions, held at the Royal Cornwall Showground, Wadebridge.

The day began with an introduction from three athletes, one of whom, Annie Vernon, had won a silver medal in the 2008 Olympics held in Beijing. The children were excited to see the


medal that Annie had brought along to share with them.
