Year 6 – Outdoor Learning

The second Year 6 outdoor learning group engaged with nature and history on their visit to Copperhouse pool nature reserve and King George V memorial walk. They began the nature trail with a discussion about why and when the memorial walk was developed, and

what it was previously used for. During the trail they stopped off at key points, using binoculars to observe the variety of wildlife including the many species of birds that visit the reserve. The children used a compass to understand direction and why this location is ideal for the





Finally, they all gathered together to make sure everyone had understood the nature quiz and to appreciate how these unique landscapes offer important habitats for wildlife. This visit complements their previous visit to the dunes, focusing on local and contrasting landscapes within our local area.

Census Day Lunch

On Thursday, May 16, 2024, we observe National School Census Day, a crucial event where the Department for Education (DfE) gathers vital information from every school. This data aids in future planning and plays a pivotal role in determining school budgets.

One significant data point we must report is the count of Reception, Year 1, and Year 2 students partaking in Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) on this specific day. The information collected during the census influences the allocation of funding for our school's hot meal program throughout the year. It's essential to note that if your child doesn't participate in the meal service on May 16th, it impacts our funding for the remainder of the year. Should your child opt to have a meal on any other day, we must cover the cost from our school budget, as funding is solely based on meal consumption during the designated census days in October and January annually.

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Household Support Fund Changes

The entitlement criteria for automatic payments from the Household Support Fund is changing. If you have any questions regarding the changes, please DO NOT contact the school. You will need to contact Cornwall Council direct.

In order to be entitled to a payment from the Household Support Fund scheme in 2024, you must be responsible for at least one child and on 3rd June 2024 either:

- be entitled to Council Tax Support or
- have been placed in emergency accommodation by the Council

You will receive £80 per child. If you are already in receipt of Council Tax Support, then you don't have to do anything else – you will receive your payment automatically.

It is important that you submit your application by 31st May 2024.

Character – Zachary P (Year 3)


For showing such kindness and understanding to his new classmate. Well done, Zachary!
