and to Mark and his team at The Big Pink Tree for once again providing us with a beautiful wreath.





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
### <u>Year 6 – Godrevy Warren</u>

Last Friday, our Year 6 outdoor learning group explored the unique and scientifically important habitat of Godrevy Warren. They learned about the history of the area, the formation of the dunes and the geology of the surrounding area. The area itself is not open to the public and is a site of specific scientific interest being home to around 25% of Cornwall's plant species.

While exploring the warren, the wildlife and habitats were identified and discussed. The children learned how to carry and use tools safely and used these to cut down the shrubs and prepare the fire. They all had a thoroughly enjoyable experience and look forward to returning in the spring term.











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
### Year 5 – Nexus Workshop



A highlight of the term has been the trip to the Nexus campus of CSIA to study gears, levers and pulleys. The children were able to make predictions using their scientific knowledge and test their predictions in the lab. Using force meters, the children tested the effect of using levers to lift a load. They recorded their results and wrote a conclusion. Next, using a variety of gears, the children learned how the teeth of gears interlock to produce different outputs. Finally, linked to a real like cow rescue by

the fire service, the children recorded

how pulleys are used to make lifting easier. The children had a great experience, and we would like to thank Mrs Richmond for supporting this educational visit.







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### **New Musical Instruments**

Children from across the school have enjoyed


investigating the new glockenspiels, recorders, triangles and egg shakers.


We also did a PE challenge. We threw bean bags into hula hoops, we raced, slid bean bags onto a line and we had a hula hoop race.

huge secondary school site - my group finished first. At the end we had to unscramble the word, it was, well, that would be telling! I learned that I was good at orienteering, and it was very fun.









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### **Anti-Bullying Week**




Across the school this

week all the children


have been recognizing Anti-Bullying week in appropriate ways. This years theme is Reach Out.

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


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### **Sponsored Reading Event**
