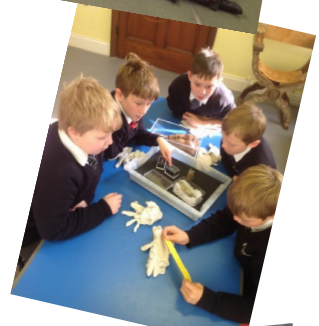

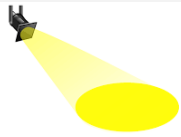


ATTENDANCE

Our school target for attendance is 96%.

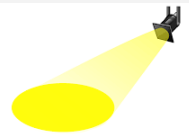
