marshmallows before bedtime.





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

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
















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Year 3 – Prima Bakeries Pasty Day

<u>Advance Notice - Lockdown</u> Practice

In line with health and safety, as you will be aware, we are required to run practice 'fire' drills, which we undertake every half term.

We also run, practice 'lockdown' drills. This covers any scenario where, rather than evacuating the children and staff, everyone would need to 'lockdown' safely inside their classrooms. This will involve all doors/windows being closed, blinds being drawn and children and staff sheltering under tables.

We have practiced this previously, so children and staff are familiar with the process, however teachers will be discussing the drill with the children, prior to it taking place. This will be done in an age appropriate, supportive manor.

We are advising parents/carers that this drill is planned for next Tuesday, 2nd July.


