Linked to their topic 'Where does my food go?', year 4 had a visit from Mrs Davies, who is a Dental Hygienist. The children learned all

about the different types of teeth and their function, together with how to look after their teeth with regular brushing and visits to the dentist. In order to show the appearance of plaque on their teeth, the children chewed a disclosing tablet, which showed where plaque was present. After a good brushing of teeth, the plaque disappeared leaving the children with a beautiful white smile!

A great big thank you to Mrs Davies for taking the time to share her knowledge and expertise with our children.



Next week is 'National Recycle Week'. At Connor Downs, we are aiming to encourage everyone to recycle more so we decided to join forces with the largest sustainable schools programme in the world; 'Eco schools'. The aim of this programme is to empower our children to be the change factor that our sustainable world needs by immersing them in activities and learning through the **Eco-Schools** natural environment. We will be focusing on a range of topics that will enable our children to achieve a green flag award. The driving force will be our new 'Eco

Warrior Team,' consisting of two children from each year group between Years 2 to Year 6. They will encourage whole school and community involvement whilst developing skills and knowledge around environmental issues. During the next few weeks, this team will lead an eco-committee and undertake an audit that will allow them to focus on their chosen topics. Connor Downs Academy already teaches our children respect for the environment through outdoor activities and environmental science but we aim that by joining this programme, it will allow us to share our vision widely and achieve national recognition through the green flag eco school award.

Bikeability continued this week with children from KS2 developing their cycling and road safety skills. Well done everybody for taking part. Thank you to the parent and carers for your support in bringing bicycles to school.

### **DONATION OF CAKES**


