school, a representative from the mine's outreach programme. Mr Hosking shared a number of tools, clothes and photographs from the mine's history. The children had lots of fun hearing


about the conditions the miners had to work in, the clothes they would have worn and the tools they used.



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Attendance and Holidays During Term Time

A polite reminder that as per the Aspire Academy Trust Attendance policy, all absences associated with a holiday (without exceptional circumstance) during term time will be marked as unauthorised within the register.

Any parents known to have removed their child from school for the sole purpose of a holiday may be referred to the Local Authority and be issued with a penalty notice fine or referred to the Local Authority to consider prosecution.

Aspire Academy Trust believes that children need to be in school for all sessions so that they can make the most progress possible.

<u>Lateness</u>

We are also seeing an increasing number of children arriving late to school.

We believe that arriving at school on time is essential for children to fulfil their potential. Being on time to school ensures that children settle into the school day and prevents them from missing essential learning. Children who arrive on time are happier, less anxious, and ready to learn.


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Connor Downs Academy Shining Stars Friday 7th June 2024
