

Measles and MMR vaccination

Following recent cases of Measles, The UK Health Security Agency's (UKHSA) warns the virus can spread very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. Measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can kill. Measles usually starts with cold like symptoms followed by a rash. Children are at risk of measles if they haven't had the recommended 2 doses of the MMR vaccination. Nuts in School

A gentle reminder that Connor Downs Academy is a **nut free** school. We have children and members of staff in our Academy who have severe nut allergies. We ask all parents/carers to ensure that they do not send their child to school with any items containing nuts. Thank you for your support.



Hair styles

If your child has hair longer than shoulder length it must be tied back for school. This limits the transmission of headlice and also supports concentration. Children should not have artificially coloured hair or extreme hair styles. No coloured or oversized hair bows or ribbons. Navy ribbons or scrunchies or small bows are allowed.

<u>Jewellery</u>

Children may wear small, plain, stud earrings, and a watch. Longer earrings present a health and safety risk of injury during play. Children remain responsible for these items and the school will not be held liable for any loss.

Jumpers and Coats

Please ensure your child/children have their school jumper with them every day and also a warm, waterproof coat, hat scarf and gloves.

Pre-Loved Uniform

We believe that school uniform ensures all children are treated equally. Uniform still plays a vital role in promoting the ethos of a school, setting an appropriate tone for education and providing a sense of belonging and common identity regardless of background.

For confidently reading aloud with clarity and expression, a lovely piece of writing he had produced using a wide range of punctuation. Well done, Arthur!


Character – Logan (Year 6)


