They are learning new skills and knowledge of a variety of positions such as classic 1. Well done to all of Year 3!

### Year 3 – Cornwall Hospice Care Cards

During the summer term, the children from Year 3 were invited by local charity, Cornwall Hospice Care, to create card designs. These cards were commissioned to be part of a Welcome Home pack for patients of St Julia's Hospice, Hayle.

#### <u>Year 6 – Taster Day – Hayle Academy</u>

The children learned about sequencing and practised giving the correct order of commands to make a character move and explore a made-up world.

> In DT, the children made geo-structures using sweets and toothpicks. They learnt the best way to keep the structure strong and stable, as well as how to work with others.

> In Drama, the children thoroughly enjoyed a range of games to improve the children's ability to think quickly and control their bodies.



Applying for a place in a reception class for children born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019

#### Attending a nursery or pre-school

You will need to apply even if your child attends a school's nursery or pre-school class. Please note that if a school is oversubscribed the fact that a child attends a school's nursery or pre-school, or a local nursery or pre-school, does not automatically guarantee a place at that school. The school's oversubscription criteria will be used to allocate places. Visit our website or contact us for more information.

# Applying for a reception class place for September 2023

#### Special Educational Needs

If an Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan has been issued for your child you do not need to complete an application form. Please contact the Statutory SEN Service for more information: Tel: 01872 324242 Email: statutorysen@cornwall.gov.uk

#### 1) Decide on your preferred schools

You are strongly advised to name **three** preferences on the application form. Naming a second or third preference does not give you any less chance of getting a place at your preferred school. When making your decision you should...

...think about how you will get your child to school. Go to www.cornwall.gov.uk/schooltransport for more information on whether your child would be entitled to transport to school.

...look at the **admission arrangements** on our website that will be used to allocate places for each school.

...consider naming your **nearest or designated** school as one of your preferences. You can find your nearest or designated school on our website.

...look at the detailed admissions information on our website, also available on request.

2) Submit your application by 15 January 2023

If you applied on time you will be notified of your allocation on **National Offer Day: 17 April 2023. Apply on time!** Late applications will only be dealt with after National Offer Day and there may not be any places left at your preferred schools.

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
