Careers Morning

On Wednesday we were delighted to welcome a variety of parents/carers into school to talk to our children about their different careers. This was a truly wonderful morning where all the children were introduced to a huge variety of careers. We would like to say a sincere thank you to every parent/carer who gave up their time to come and share their careers with the children.





Year 3 had a fantastic careers morning with a hands-on experience, learning about the role of a Gas Engineer, a Solicitor and a Chef on a North Sea Oil Rig.

Jack who shared a fascinating talk on the use of a tractor within agriculture. We also had two lorry visits, including one from Scania.



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


Thank you to Mr Nash who came to speak to Year 6 on career's day this week. As an Artificial Intelligence
