I hope that you and your families are well. We have had another very full and engaging week in our Academy.



Mental Health Day – Monday 10th October



Monday this week marked Mental Health Day. We all have mental health and it affects how we think, feel and act and how we deal with life. In classes this week, the children have been looking at ways to identify behaviours which indicates where our mental health sits.

> In Reception Class this week, the children have been reading the story of 'The Colour Monster' for Mental Health Awareness Week. The children looked at the different emotions the monster had throughout the story and thoroughly enjoyed acting out these emotions. The children also retold parts of the story using puppets.

Year 2 explored positive mental health. The children shared ideas,

alongside our powerpoint. They then represented pictorially and in writing the things we can do to help to maintain our mental health. The children focused on remembering that we are all special just the way we are.





The children in Year 3 worked together to help each other feel happier by

playing the Motional game, Guess The Picture. It was great to see their teamwork, co-operation and smiling faces as they played.





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As part of World Mental Health Day, Year 4 completed their motional activity where they explored different percussive

instruments. They were also looking to see if they could spot any adults in school wearing yellow to show their support for World Mental Health Day.

Year 5 took part in a musical activity combining playing rhythms to the sound of a heartbeat, with a focus on breathing exercises and keeping time in a group.





Year 6 – Outdoor Learning (Group 1)

Last Friday our year 6 outdoor learning group explored the unique and scientifically important

habitat of Godrevy Warren. They learned about the history of the area, the formation of the dunes and the geology

of the surrounding area. The area itself is not open to the public and is a site of specific scientific interest being home to around 25% of Cornwall's plant species. They walked around the warren observing habitats and wildlife, and also learned how to carry and use tools safely. They

particularly enjoyed digging up the shrubs and preparing the fire, while sheltering from the sudden deluge of



rain. This did not dampen their spirits and at the end of the afternoon they were rewarded with a roaring fire, which later became the oven for our baked potatoes. They all had a thoroughly enjoyable experience.

This week the children have been excited to welcome a new friend to Connor Downs Academy. The hedgehog has been named Prickles and Paws.

Year 2 – Lanhydrock House

On Friday 7th October Year 2 had an exciting trip to Lanhydrock House. The children were amazing history detectives and learnt so



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many new things about the family that lived there and what life was like for them. They were curious and asked many questions. The children's learning iournev will now continue back in the classroom through our exploration of the Victorian period. Thank you to all the parent/carers who came along to help. It was a wonderful day and the children represented Connor Downs Academy in a very positive way showing politeness and a great attitude to learning.





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<u>Year 4 – Brass Lessons</u>

The children in Year 4 have just begun a 10 week first access course to learn to play a variety of brass instruments. Each week, Mrs Burden, from Cornwall Music Service Trust is coming into school to deliver a lesson. The children are then able to take their instruments home with them to practice during the week.

On Wednesday, Year 6 were visited by Mr Gallagher who brought in his collection of WW2 artefacts, including a pen and ink pot, some binoculars, old coins and decommissioned weapons.
