


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












#### School Field Camping – Years 3 – 6

Next week, as part of our outdoor and adventurous provision, each of our KS2 classes will be camping on the school field for one night.


We have hired bell tents to make our own CDA campsite on our secure site. Children will stay in single sex tents separated by staff and parent volunteer (DBS checked) tents.

The children will come to school on their chosen day as normal. We advise that all children have a hot school dinner (please book this via ParentPay)

at lunch time as the children will all require a packed tea and beverage. At the end of the day, they will be transported via school minibus to the Towans for an evening stroll along the beach and enjoy their picnic tea by the sea. The children will then return to school for some games, teambuilding and entertainment before getting ready for bed.

In the morning, the children will change back into their uniforms and have breakfast as a class in the school hall.

If the weather is inclement, the camp may have to be cancelled. In the event of an emergency in the night, there will be the option of moving the camp to the school hall and classrooms. Of course, if there is a concern your child's class teacher will call you so, please make sure that your emergency contact numbers are up to date.

You will recall that Connor Downs Academy received a Section 8 Ofsted Inspection on the 8th and 9th May 2024.


