This week in geography, Year 6 have made 3D pyramids and decorated them with facts about the Andes, as part of their unit about South America.






They have also enjoyed playing the Carol King song 'You got a Friend' with the xylophones in Music.







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
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Year 5 - DT

Sustrans Big Walk & Wheel 2024

Sustrans Big Walk & Wheel is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge, inspiring pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in their neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world.

Active travel is a great way to build physical activity into children's daily routine, helping them arrive at school more relaxed and alert; it's great for their mental wellbeing too.

This year the challenge runs from 11th March to 22nd March 2024, so we are encouraging all families, where it is safe and feasible to do so, to walk, cycle or scoot to school each day during this period.

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Aspire Connect 40 Relay Challenge

The **Aspire Connect 40 Relay Challenge** is a trust-wide, team-focussed feat of endurance taking place from **6**th **to 15**th **March 2024** to raise money for two fantastic causes, in equal part - Red Nose Day* and Youth Sport Trust**.

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Circumnavigating the whole of Cornwall, 36 Aspire academies, two outdoor education centres (Carlyon Bay and Carnyorth) and two central core service

buildings (Truro and St Austell) will be connected via a non-competitive relay route with adult participants using only physical activity as the mode of travel. Whether it's walking, running, cycling, rowing, horse riding or swimming, physical exertion is key and anything involving an engine is strictly off limits!

Special thanks to Mr Pascoe and Miss Bromley who yesterday represented Connor Downs Academy. Mr Pascoe connected with the staff from St Uny C of E Academy and ran with the baton from Carbis Bay to Connor Downs Academy. Some of the children assembled in the playground to welcome

Mr Pascoe and to witness the handover of the baton to Miss Bromley. Miss Bromley then cycled with a member of staff from

Crowan Primary School to hand the baton over for the next leg. We are very proud and grateful to both Mr Pascoe and Miss Bromley for their contributions to the relay challenge!

This is not just a fundraising event for the grown-ups. Pupils here at Connor Downs Academy have been actively involved, raising money for the two nominated charities through our school-led event - The Connor Downs Comic Relief and Youth Sports Trust Fitness Challenge - on Friday 15th March.
